Season 1 Episode 1 The Ways of God

This episode defines the phrase “the ways of God,” something we see throughout the Bible. We read in Psalm 103 that God made His ways known to Moses, His acts to the people of Israel. David asks in Psalm 25 “Make me to know your ways, O LORD...” Lionshare’s Dave Buehring explains that “the ways of God” means God’s path on a matter, how God does stuff and how He wants us to approach life.

Definition: God’s path on a matter. How God does stuff.

- His heart, perspective, attitude and actions
- Universal, Timeless and Practical
- Tethered to Scripture; not just a good suggestion

Scripture References

- Exodus 34:13-14 - “If you are pleased with me, *teach me your ways* so I may know you and continue to find favor with you. Remember that this nation is your people.” The LORD replied, ‘My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.’”
- Isaiah 55:8, 9 – “For my thoughts are not your thoughts, *neither are your ways my ways*, declares the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are *my ways higher than your ways* and my thoughts than your thoughts.”
- Psalm 25:4, 5 – “Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths.
- Psalm 103:7 – “He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.”
